

The Battle of Great Bridge on December 9, 1775, was an overwhelming victory for the Virginia Colony. Because the British lost this one battle, they were forced to give up their rule over the largest and richest of the thirteen colonies. So how did minutemen defeat the best army in the world?

This booklet explains the influence of a newspaper, a hero, and a Royal Governor seeking to maintain proper order in an increasingly rebellious people. 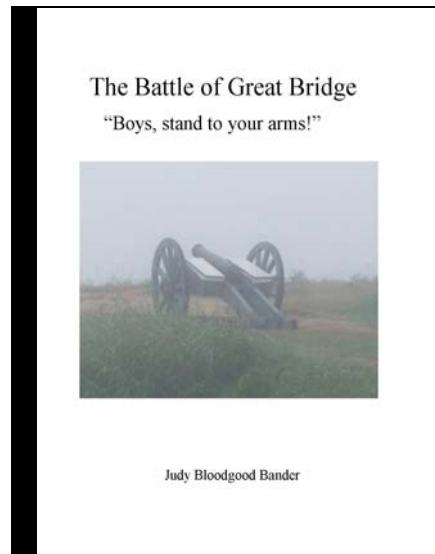
